Zoning Issues You Should be Aware of:

- ◆ If you require an inspection by the Lucas County Health Department for a room addition or accessory building, you may be required to bring your old septic tank up to code acceptance. Call 419-213-4100.
- ◆ For new or tentative property buyers: to find out if your property contains "wetlands" call the Lucas Soil & Water District at 419-893-1966, or contact the Army Corps of Engineers at 419-893-3491.
- ◆ All signs, including real estate, political, garage sale, for sale, etc. are NOT permitted in the road right-of-way.
- ◆ Unlicensed or inoperable vehicles are only permitted if they are under roof. Outside storage is not permitted. A suggestion: if you wish to dispose of any such vehicles call 419-832-2853.
- ◆ Sheds under 100 square feet don't required a zoning permit; and sheds under 120 square feet don't require a building permit.
- ◆ All property lot splitting is initiated with the Lucas County Planning Commission. Call 419-245-1200. The minimum buildable lot in Waterville Township must have a frontage of 135 feet, and be a minimum of 1 net acre in size.
- ◆ Township tours by members of the Zoning Board are conducted in the spring and fall. Violation reminders will be made by phone and/or letter by the Zoning Inspector. Repeated violators will be contacted by the Township Solicitor and if conditions persist will be referred to the Maumee Prosecutors Office.

If you have any zoning questions or concerns, call your Zoning Inspectors: Eric Gay at 419-877-0156 and Joe Bublick at 419-472-7663.

Any Township resident having questions about annexation and the provision of water and sewer services should contact one of the Trustees or the Township Clerk. The circumstances under which a municipality can require annexation in exchange for water and sewer service are limited by contract and by geographic area. Annexations of Township property by Waterville are further governed by an Annexation Agreement and annexations of Township property by Whitehouse are subject to a Memorandum of Understanding.

On December 30, 2004, Judge Robert G. Christiansen issued an opinion upholding the constitutionality of the law that allows townships to separate from villages. The issue had been taken to court by the Lucas County Commissioners because another Ohio court found this law to be unconstitutional in 1992. The Lucas County Commissioners were concerned about taking action of the petitions, given the question whether the law was valid. The Lucas County Court now says that R.C. 503.09 is valid. Judge Christiansen stated in his opinion that "the purpose of R.C. 503.09 is to permit township residents to achieve self-government....". The ruling of the court authorizes the County Commissioners to move forward with the separation process. The Commissioners have already acknowledged that the petition filed met all legal requirements. The ruling satisfies the questions of the County Commissioners, but has been appealed by Trustee Tim Pedro and township resident Anton Urbas. The pending appeal continues to delay action by the County on the separation process.

Police Levy on November 8th Ballot

Waterville Township voters will see a Police Levy on the November 8th ballot. In 1985 you passed a 1.9 mill levy. Currently the levy is collecting .81 mill. The requested replacement levy will restore the 1.9 mill. Per the county auditor's office, restoring the 1.9 mill would assess a \$150,000 home \$50 per year above the current collection. The auditor's office also noted that the \$50 per year will decrease as new homes are built in our township.

Residents MUST do the following.

1. Leaves should be raked prior to scheduled pick up dates.
2. No sticks, bricks, trash, etc are to be placed in the piles of leaves.
3. No parking at the piles of leaves.
4. Leaves must NOT be more than eight (8) feet from the curb or roadside.
5. Leaves must NOT be around poles, signs or mailboxes.
