Department Reports

Police/Fire:

Chief Bingham introduced Tom and Kathy Schmidt. They are delivering Vaeda tonight. She is a 6 week Belgian Malinois. She will be starting continuous training next week and will be working and residing with Officer Stuber. Chief Bingham also introduced Cheri and Nicole Summers. They are organizing the fund raising for Vaeda. Dog food is being donated by manufacturer. Chief Bingham presented the K-9 contract as provided by Solicitor Sanderson. Discussion ensued regarding Vaeda and training.

Chief Bingham announced that the equipment being purchased with the Jag Law Enforcement Grant has been ordered.

Chief Bingham stated that there is a need for additional shot guns and stated that he would like to use funds received from police forfeitures and also trade in firearms no longer in use to aid in purchasing the shotguns. Karen Schneider made a motion to sell the old guns and use the proceeds to purchase the new shotguns. Seconded by Les Disher. Motion carried.

Chief Bingham announced that he is in the process of hiring 3 new auxillary officers. Chief Bingham announced that there is a 1K run occurring in Whitehouse and the township on March 19. He is expecting approximately 700-1000 runners. The township police department will be working with the Whitehouse police department. Chief Bingham announced the Family Fun Night Fundraiser at Anthony Wayne High School on March 11.

Chief Bingham recommends sending either a full time or part-time officer to work with the D.A.R.T. team 2 days a month and also send an auxillary officer 2 days a month. He would like to do this until the end of the year as long as financially able to. Les Disher made a motion to assist the Lucas County Sheriff and the D.A.R.T. team. Seconded by Karen Schneider. Motion carried.

Roads/Cemeteries:

Richard has some work to be done on the F450.

Proposal received from Waterville Bodyworks. Discussion ensued regarding the repairs and the Trustees would like to see a second proposal. Upon receiving a

second proposal Kyle Hertzfeld is to have repairs made. Les Disher made a motion to approve the repairs to the Ford F450 mirrors. Seconded by Kyle Hertzfeld. Motion carried.
